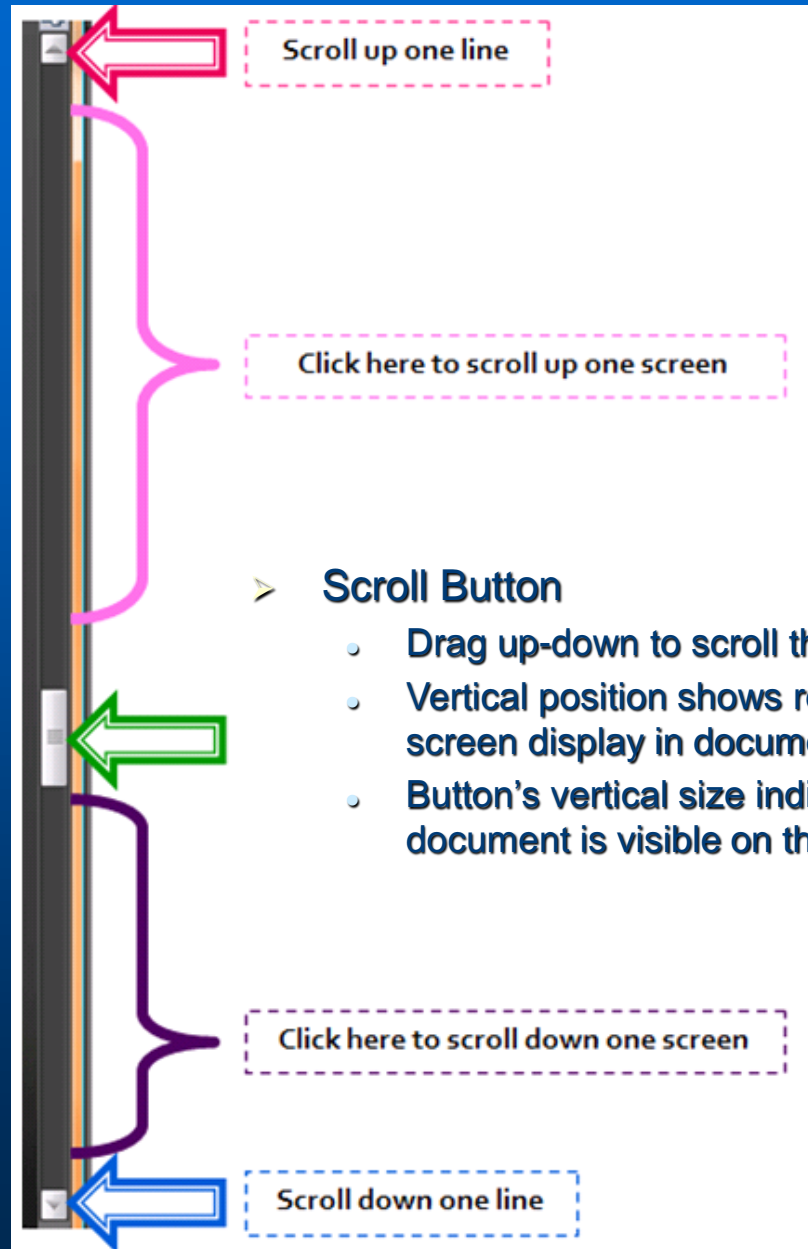

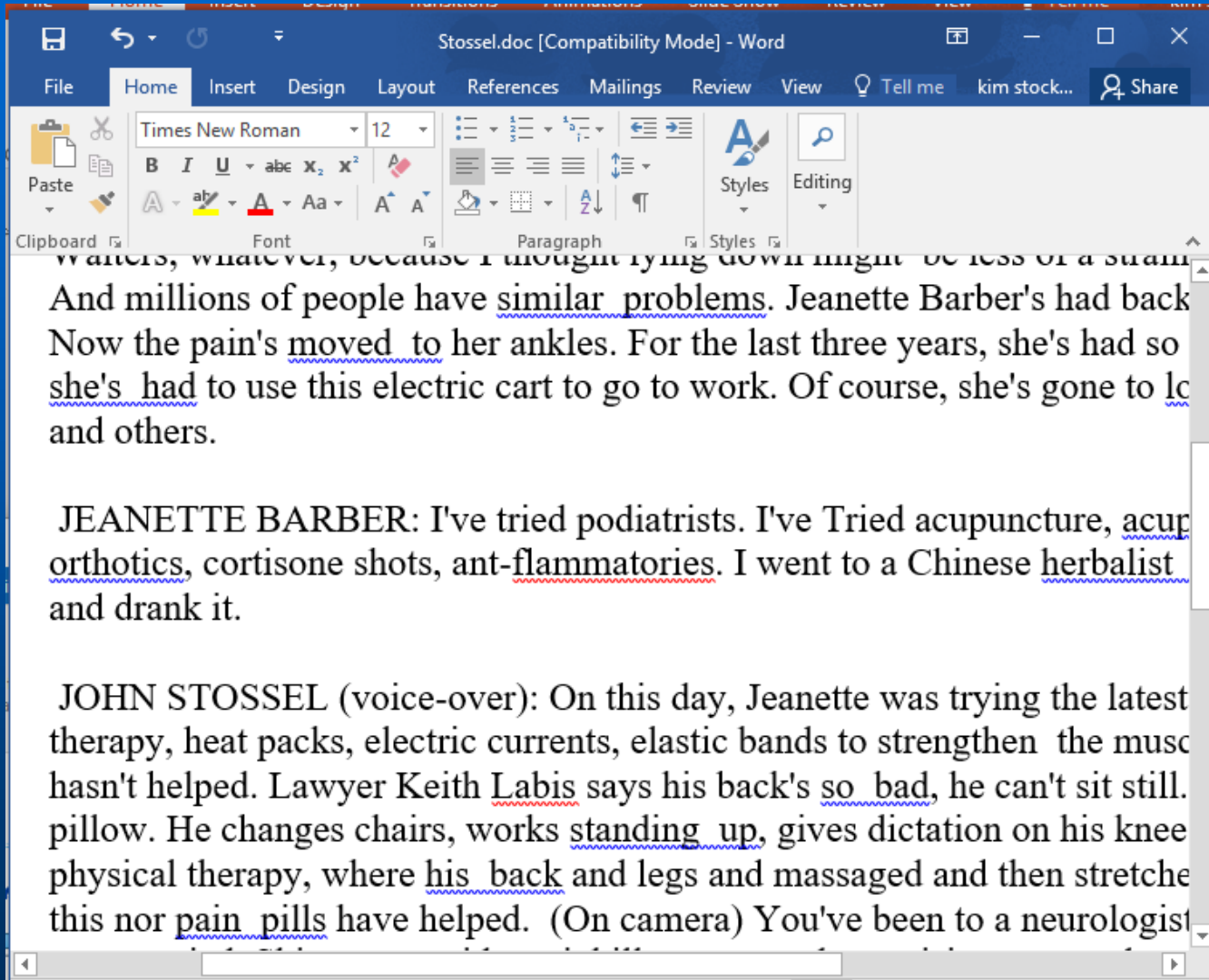
Vertical Scroll Bar



➤ Scroll Button

- Drag up-down to scroll thru the document
- Vertical position shows relative position of the screen display in document.
- Button's vertical size indicates how much of document is visible on the screen.

Vertical Scroll Bar

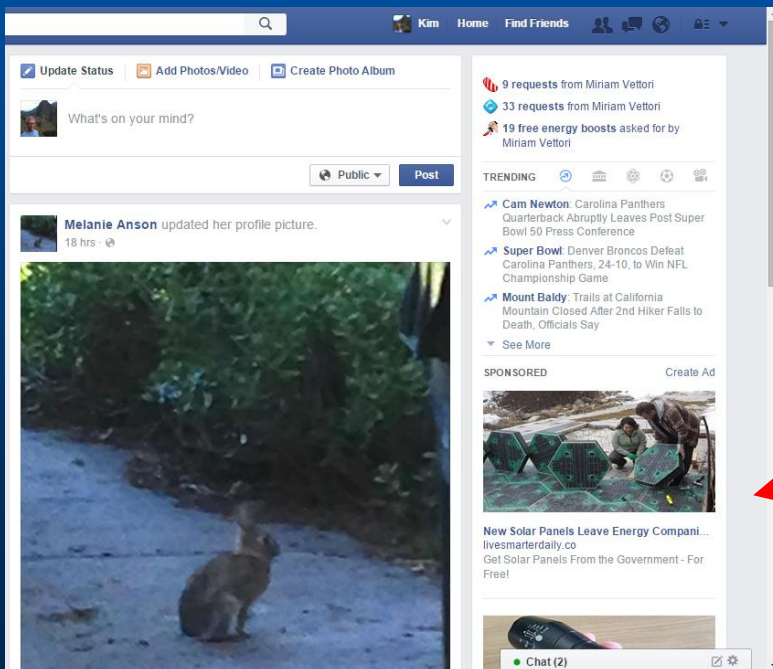


Note that this window also has a horizontal Scroll Bar

Vertical Scroll Bar

➤ The endless Vertical Scroll Bar?


- When scrolling down the page, while you are looking at the screen, some websites keep adding content to the bottom, moving your scroll button back up and making it smaller.
- Such as the Timeline in Facebook:



Scroll Button about 1/3 of total scroll bar height; therefore 3 screen pages??

When you click here which should take you to page 2 of 3 then you get...

Vertical Scroll Bar



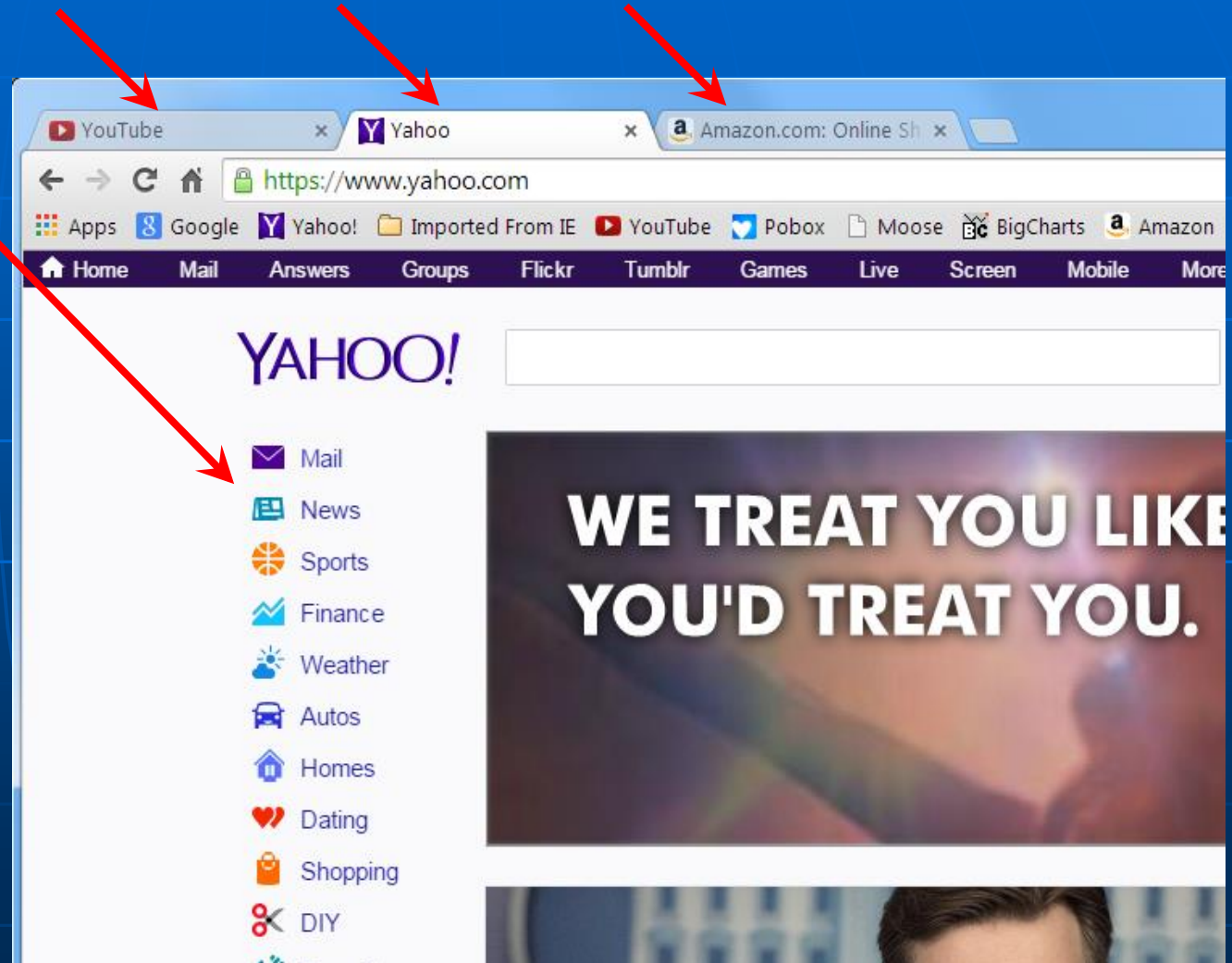

Tabbed Browsing

Three tabs are open in the web browser
(You Tube, Yahoo, Amazon)



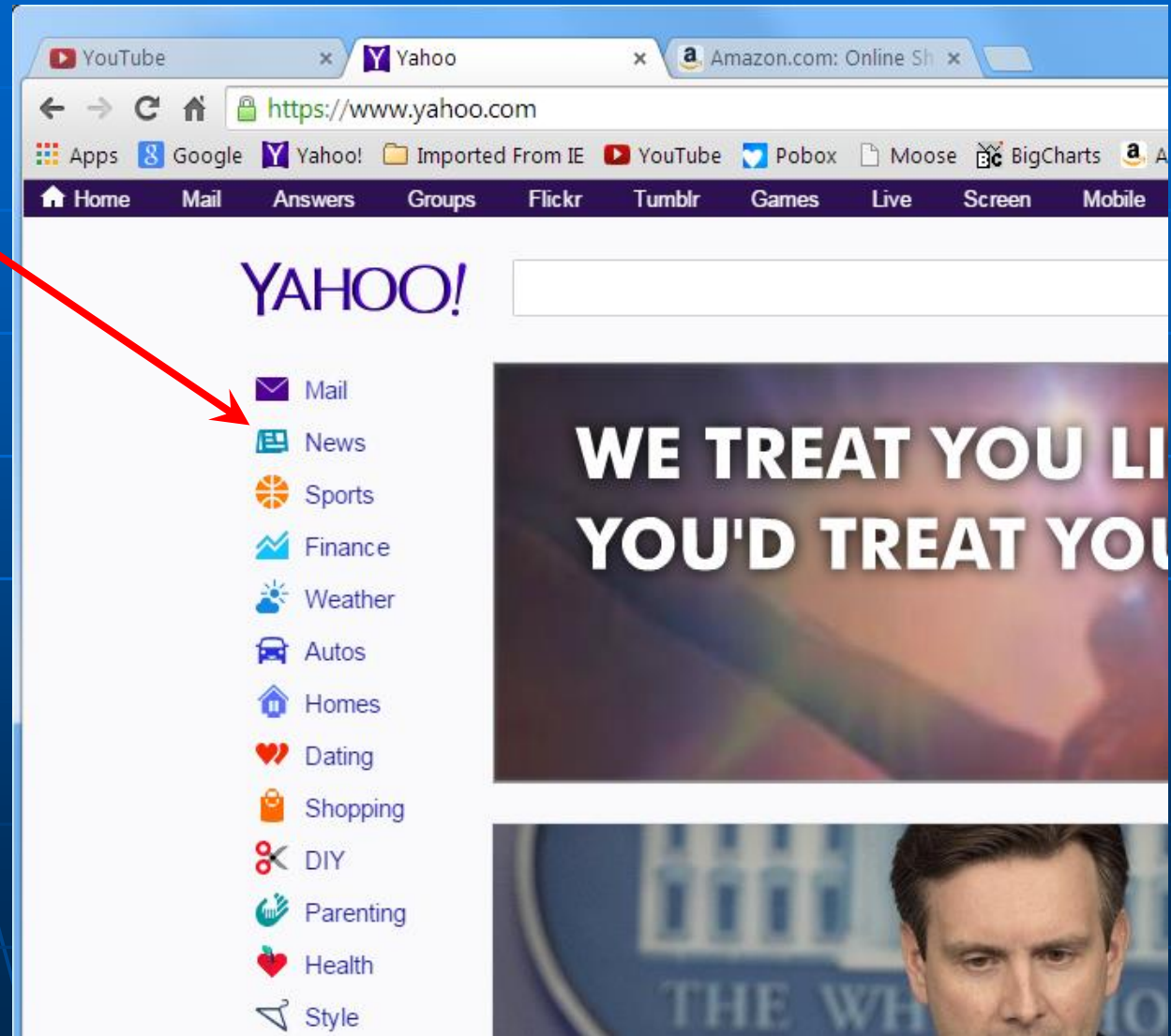
Click the "News" link and the link could open in either:

- 1) A new tab in the existing browser (making 4 tabs open)
- 2) A new web browser window
- 3) Replace the content on the existing tab

Opening Links on Web Pages

Right Click the "News" link and you get a contextual menu:

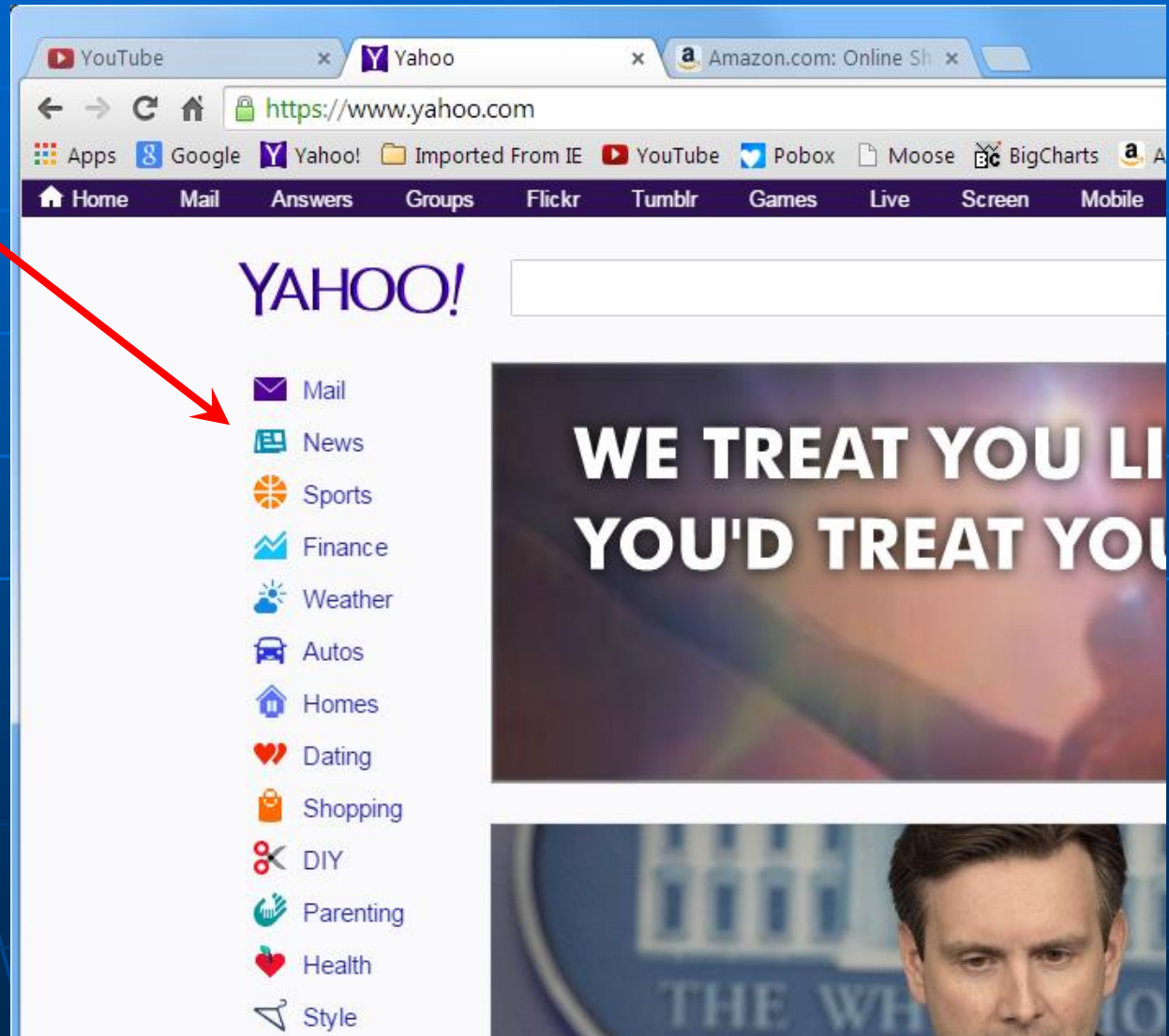
- Open link in new tab
- Open link in new window
- Open link in incognito window
- Save link as...
- Copy link address



Opening Links onto a new Tab

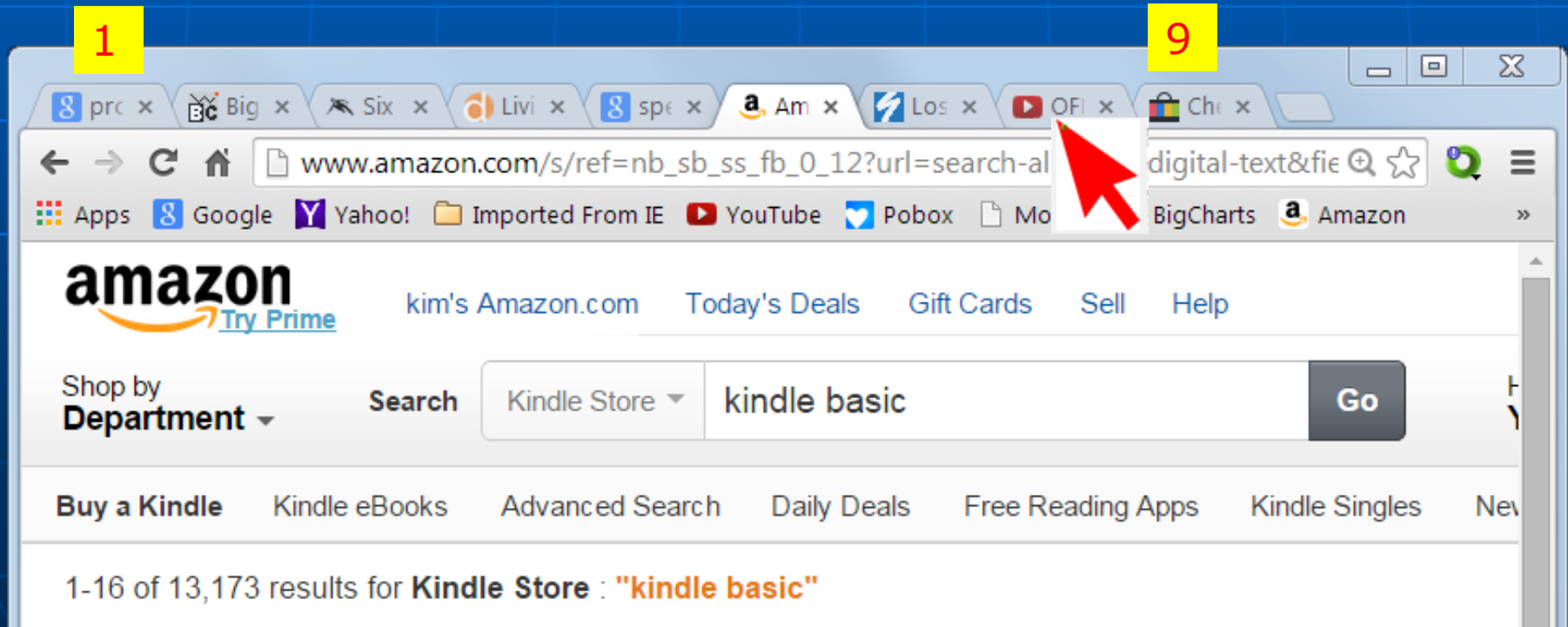
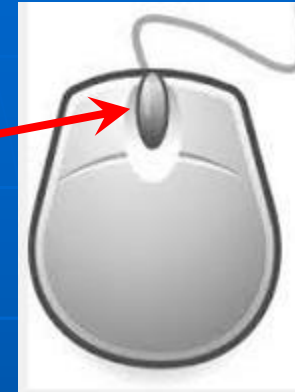
To make sure you open "News" link in a new tab:

- 1) Rt Click the link's contextual menu and select "open link in new tab", or:
- 2) Click down on the mouse scroll wheel.



Closing Web Page Tabs

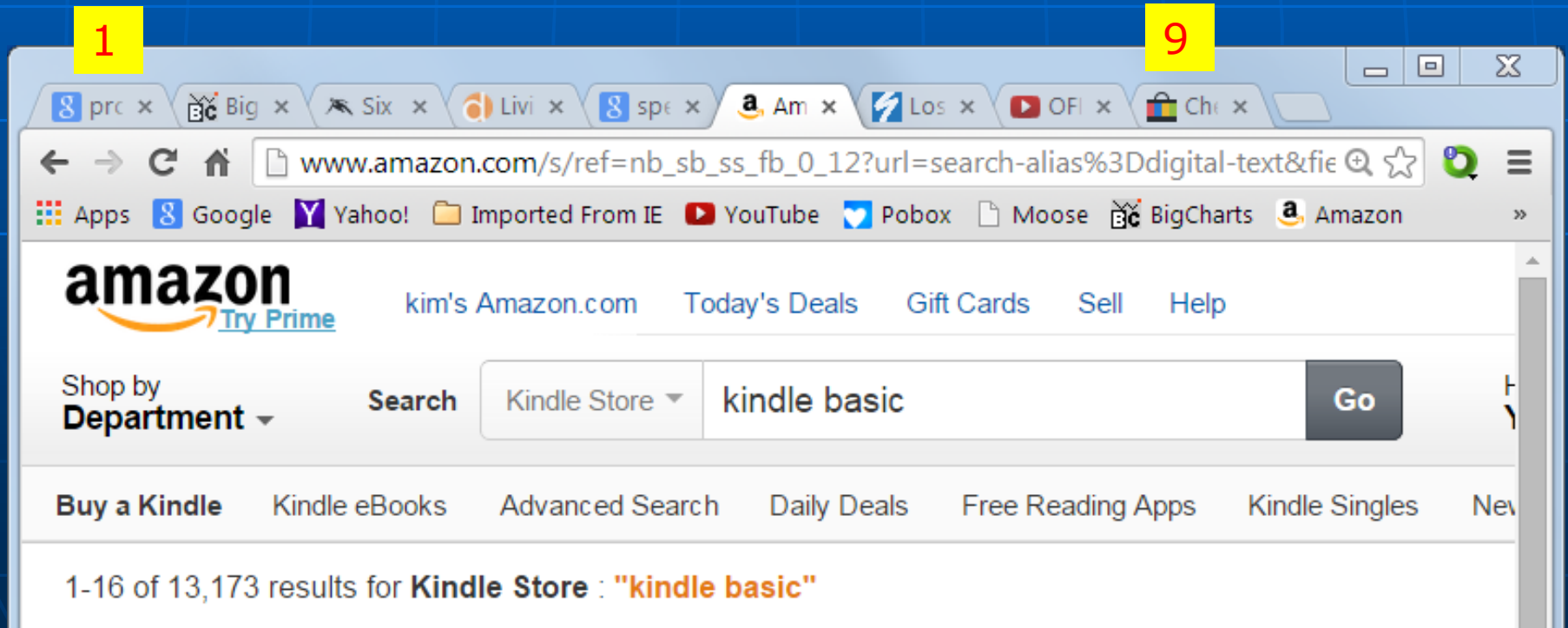
The browser window shown below has 9 tabs open. To quickly close any tab, place the mouse pointer over that tab, and click down on the mouse scroll wheel. In the window below, the red mouse pointer is over tab #8, so clicking down the mouse scroll wheel will close that tab.



Accidentally Close a Web Page Tab?

PageTab?

If you accidentally close a web page tab, you can get it back by entering Ctrl-Shift-T. Additional Ctrl-Shift-T will bring back additional tabs that were closed.
